Community Agreements**

- **Working Assumptions:**
 - Everyone has wisdom
 - We need everyone’s wisdom for the wisest result
 - There are no wrong answers
 - The whole is greater than the sum of its parts
 - Everyone will hear others and be heard
- **Addressing each other:**
 - We ask that everyone include the pronouns you use after your name (e.g. Makeda - she/her).
 - This ensures that we do not make assumptions about the pronouns we use. Examples of pronouns are: they/them, she/her, he/him, zir/hir, sie/zie. If you do not use pronouns (for instance, you just use your name. E.g. Josh - use name only) please also indicate this. Be mindful of being inclusive in the ways that we address one another. An example of this would be not to assume gender identity and lump people into gendered categories. For example, if you feel drawn towards using “guys” or “ladies” to refer to a group of people, please use “folks” instead.
- **Engaging on the virtual platform:**
 - It’s up to you whether you want to have your video on or off. We suggest that when you’re in your small, breakout groups you consider turning on your camera if you have the bandwidth and are comfortable]
 - We will use the chat to engage, including to indicate when someone would like to speak, share ideas, or ask a question.
 - All panel and plenary discussions will be recorded so that Action Canada and our report writer can go back to the recording if clarification is needed on any knowledge or information to come out of the panels and plenaries. We will not be video or audio recording the small group discussions.
 - While all information to come out of this gathering (including info from the small group discussions) will be used for campaign content, we will not be attributing what is said in plenaries or small group discussions to individuals.
